At the General Council Meeting of 1934, held at Oberlin, the Council for Social Action was established. CSA worked through several sub-committees - agricultural, industrial, legislative, international, and race relations. There was always criticism and opposition to CSA, especially in the early 1950s from the League to Uphold Congregational Principles and the Committee Opposing Congregational Political Action. This culminated in a Board of Review hearing under General Council in 1953. The Council continued, with final transfer of functions to the Council for Christian Social Action of the United Church of Christ in 1961.

Records represented here are through 1956 and up to the point of the merger to form the UCC. The records of CSA/CCSA were separated, with the UCC Archives sending CSA records to the Congregational Library and retaining CCSA in Lancaster. In general, then, post-1956 records are held with the CCSA at UCC Archives in Lancaster, PA.
